Christmas Message

Though we are very encouraged by the news of the success of vaccine trials, the next few months are unlikely to be easy for any of us; and especially for those who live alone or have difficulties with their mental or physical health. Even if limited family gatherings are allowed at Christmas, many will feel it wise to make even more modest plans. In Dr Seuss' children's tale, The Grinch only stole the presents – meaning that the fun and community of Christmas was scarcely affected. But this year the virus will take at least some of that away from us – and it will be sorely missed by the majority.

Christian believers will inevitably share that loss, and our 2020 church Christmas celebrations will have to be on a more limited scale too. But the truths we celebrate each year remain unaffected. The Good News of the Lord's coming into our world 2000 years ago gives us the real **comfort** that, despite our many shortcomings, God has not abandoned us.

More than that, the news of Jesus' coming remains a cause of great **joy**, because of the salvation that he brings. Luke's gospel records the angel's message to the shepherds:

Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord.

Luke 2:10-11

Amidst these difficult times, we hope and pray that many in the Westlands will discover something of the comfort and the joy that Christ's coming to our world brings.
