9 am service

We are encouraging people to see this service as primarily for those who are: COVID-vulnerable; but not generally in contact with many other people; and with quite a bit of protection by having been vaccinated (ie 3 weeks or more after 1st jab). Numbers are also limited to 35

11.00am service

On Easter Sunday this will be held outside, in order to allow greater numbers safely. From 11th April onwards we are aiming to hold the service inside. This will nonetheless hold 55 people whilst still allowing 2m distancing between households and good safety levels.
