

The last couple of years have been the most turbulent times that most of us have ever experienced. No sooner had we felt that we were making progress in the battle with Covid, we were confronted with graphic pictures of war in Eastern Europe. It's understandable why cynicism or despair can set in.

The bible sees a source of lasting hope, though, in the events that took place on the first Easter Day 2000 years ago.

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead 1st Peter 1v3

In the life, the death, and the miraculous resurrection of Jesus, God has demonstrated his continuing commitment to our world. Believers can taste something of the difference he makes in the new birth, the new life, that we experience when we come to faith in Christ. The raising of Jesus acts as concrete proof too that we can trust his promise to one day return to usher in an age without death or mourning or crying or pain.

The early service (now at 8.30am) service continues to request that those who are able to, wear masks. It also offers extra spacing for those who feel the need to minimise their risk.
