

Our church council's current thinking is that, instead of our original plan to extend the church, it may be possible to use the funds we had gathered to erect a replacement building on roughly the same site as our current church hall. We are negotiating with a local company who has considerable experience of erecting this kind of building, and may be applying for planning permission in the Spring.

#### **February Message**

Many welcome the way in which our great state occasions are marked with grand church services. As a Church of England minister I certainly do. But they can leave the rather false impression that the Christian faith is a decidedly British thing. Of course the link between the Christian church and the UK state goes back many centuries. But that should never be allowed to obscure the fact that Christianity has never exclusively 'belonged' to the British people. Rather, from its earliest beginnings, it has been a truly international faith.

In St Andrew's we hugely value the fact that our congregation includes people from quite a mix of ethnic and national backgrounds. We have also had longstanding links with specific individuals sharing the Christian faith in different parts of the world. For a number of years, we supported the Chorlton family in Egypt; then the McKnights in serving the Lord in the United Arab Emirates. Our current main link is with Katia Rocks, who has been involved in starting a new church in her home country of Brazil, in the city of Florianapolis, We are looking forward to hearing her share with us at our 10.45 service on 19th Feb.

In many ways this all serves as a foretaste of heaven as it's described by the author of Revelation, the last book of the bible. For, describing the heavenly worship of Jesus, the lamb of God, he writes

> ... I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb....and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" Revelation 7:9-10

For we believe that the good news of Jesus really is for everyone -- and that whatever your background, that includes you!

Messy Church is a fun event for all the family especially


