Link to Hope Shoebox Appeal ... thank you so much for all your shoeboxes and donations. Nationally, the final total was 26,417 Family & Elderly Shoeboxes. A small team went out to Romania this year to distribute some of them. They have written a Shoebox Delivery Diary to update you on what happened when they were there which can be accessed online via this link

In addition to also sending thousands of shoeboxes to Ukraine they write 'were also able to fund several short term projects over the Christmas period. We are very aware of the continued plight of IDF (internally displaced people) who remain as refugees in their own country without homes or belongings. We funded a soup project, Christmas meals, food parcels for families with disabled children, support for injured soldiers and mothers and families living in a safe house.' Hope Explored ... we are planning to offer *Hope Explored*, a 3 week introductory course to the Christian Faith. It will include short videos and time for discussion; and will also be suitable for anyone wanting a 'refresher' course, or for any adults interested in the possibility of being confirmed. Christmas Quiz ... we are grateful to Linda and Les Stonier for organising this, and for all who took part. £123 was raised for the new hall. Congratulations to the winners, Chris and Linda Spicer, and Tracey Holland.

Legacies ... we are very grateful to all who give generously to St Andrew's. In addition to regular and one-off giving, church funds have been boosted by several very generous legacies - which are providing a significant part of the funding for the new hall project. Over the last couple of years PCC funds have also been helped by some further legacies, from the estates of Pam Gotham, Isabelle Cooper and John Moseley. If any are considering writing a will, future generations at St Andrew's could be greatly helped in their mission through this kind of generosity.

Used Postage Stamps ... please remember to save your used postage stamps and put them in the box at the back of Church. The preferred way is to cut them from the envelopes, leaving a small border. Stamps are accepted by the Oxfam Shop, not just at Christmas but all year round and are taken regularly.

Snow/Ice ... over winter it is possible there will be snowfall or ice on the church grounds. We will endeavour to keep a pedestrian route to the front door clear on Sundays.
