This month, I'm focusing on the central part of St Andrew's new 'welcome message', Discovering God's love.

Many begin to sense God's greatness—and his care for us—by experiencing the wonder of creation. That's a great starting point! And Christians

believe that we see God's love even more clearly in the sending of his Son to our world. In Jesus life and teaching; in his resurrection from the dead on the first Easter Sunday; and also perhaps most surprisingly of all in his death on the cross for our salvation. The bible incudes the following claim:

...at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. *Romans 5:6-8*

As many are all too aware, even the most apparently sincere declarations of love can sometimes evaporate into nothing. But the Christian understanding is that we discover the Lord's love not just in his words to us, but even more in his actions— In his being willing to come to our world and to give up his life to bear our sins. What's more, God's commission to his church is to help as many as possible to find out about his love, and to invite each one to return to him and to discover it as a reality in our own lives.
