
# Collect for: The Fourth Sunday of Lent

**2024 Lent Course** ... will be continuing to focus on the events leading up to Jesus' death on the cross, looking at Luke chapters 22-24. We will meet on Wednesday in the Parish Room either at 10.30 am or 7.30 pm. All welcome.

**New Hall Progress** ... we have had very helpful discussions with Fords our builders and our recently appointed agent/clerk-of-works (a local firm of architects, Ellis Hillman). As reported before, work is delayed until at least June due to the planning requirement for a bat observation survey, which can't be done whilst most species are still hibernating. Nonetheless Fords and their architects Crofts are beginning on the detailed design; applying for building regulations approval; and preparing to submit other advance documentation required by the planning conditions. We are making progress too towards signing an

industry-standard 'JCT' contract, which will firmly fix the price of most components of the project.

We are also very grateful for those who have responded so generously to the appeal, which has seen something like an extra £43,000 given or pledged since the end of November. We remain very open to more giving! This will enable us to help meet any unforeseen extra costs and/or to avoid having to reduce the resources available for the ongoing ministry of the church too greatly. In addition, at least one further fundraising event is being planned....

**Snow/Ice** ... over winter it is possible there will be snowfall or ice on the church grounds. We will endeavour to keep a pedestrian route to the front door clear on Sundays. But even this is not always possible, and if the weather is particularly hazardous there may be occasions when we could close the car park for safety and ask cars to park on the road.
