

New Hall ... we held the planned progress meeting with Fords on Tuesday. Things are generally going well - the concrete pour to form the main base slab is on schedule for Wednesday (18th December). Fords will be taking the standard construction industry 2-week

Christmas break. There then won't be much, if any, activity on site until middle/end Jan as their focus will be on the continuing construction of the wall panels in their Blythe Bridge Factory - and possibly also waiting on the planners to agree the choice of bricks and roofing material pattern/colour.

Have You Heard of Easyfundraising? ... with Christmas coming up, and probably more people shopping online, it seems appropriate to remind people of this simple way to help with church's financial situation. If you ever order anything online (including your weekly grocery shop), you could help raise income for the church with no cost to yourself, by signing up to Easyfundraising. A small group of the congregation already belong to this, and between them have generated about £400 since 2022. A big thank you to those people. Recent PCC Decisions included ...

Mission Action Plan ... a plan for 2025/6 was agreed (link <u>here</u>) - this will be formally launched in January.

Safeguarding ... with the importance of this subject for churches highlighted recently, the PCC formalised its commitment that our local policies will take account of a 2017 policy paper which remains the foundation of CofE thinking - Promoting a safer church Our current policies are pinned on the notice board near to the hymn book shelves, and are here and here.

Coins/Silver/Gold collection ... thanks to all who have donated coins, elements of silver and gold scrap. Last weekend's visit to the Birmingham Jewellery Quarter generated another £1,224 for the Hall Fund taking the total well over £10,000. Because of this, it has been decided to continue receiving any contributions of pre:1946 British silver coins; pre:1964 USA silver coins and any scrap silver or gold bits. Funds raised will go directly into Church Funds.
