This Month's Message

Evey few years the media run a story about somebody claiming to have startling new information to add to the established understanding of Jesus, or even overturn it. Usually it turns out to be a very speculative interpretation of documents that were written far later than the gospels themselves.

However in the bible itself, there's one important episode that isn't generally included in most retellings of the nativity. It describes the visit of Mary , Joseph and Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem to perform the expected purifications. As we are told that it happened 40 days after Jesus' birth, it may even have taken place before the visit of the wise men.

In the temple they encounter two faithful older believers. Simeon was a man who had been waiting for this moment all his life. Taking their baby in his arms, he re-iterates Jesus' significance in bringing salvation to the world. But adding too that he will be a 'light of revelation' - and not just to his own nation but to all people, everywhere.

Though the narrative does not make clear how many heard Simeon's actual words, we are told that a widow called Anna was present as well. And she shared the good news of Jesus' coming with all who were open to hear it.

Our world can at times feel like a very gloomy place, metaphorically speaking, But Christians around the world continue to rejoice in the good news of Jesus' coming that has now been passed on to us—bringing light and hope.
